In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the NSW and Australian Governments have invested an additional \$21 million to support frontline services working with people experiencing domestic and family violence.

Funding was made available through NSW Government and Commonwealth Government funding as part of the Domestic and Family Violence stimulus packages.

Moree Family Support has received additional funding to extend the Staying Home Leaving Violence service to the Gwydir Shire for 12 months due to the current COVID-19 pandemic. This area encompasses the urban areas and smaller villages of Bingara, Warialda, Warialda Rail, Gravesend, Upper Horton, Coolatai, Croppa Creek and North Star.

Staying Home Leaving Violence is funded by the department of Communities and Justice and supports women over the age of 18 years old and their children to escape a violent relationship and remain safe in their own home or a home of their choice.

Staying Home Leaving Violence is a free service and aims to prevent homelessness by working with NSW Police to remove the perpetrator from the family home so that women and children can remain safely where they are.

The program provides a range of support for victims and their children such as safety planning, improving home security, assistance in managing finances, and support for children and helping women throughout the complicated legal process.
